

- May 2022: cases of monkeypox in several non-endemic countries without travel to endemic areas
- July 2022: WHO declare monkeypox a public health emergency of international concern
- December 2022: Named mpox


Diagnoses in people living with HIV

- Focus on pandemic preparedness








Qualitative research team

	Target population/source of data	Focus
Print media	Newspaper articles	Discourse analysis of language and representation, including time trends, language, themes, dissent and agreement
Social media	Twitter, TikTok and/or Facebook	Time trends, mapping, themes, visual material, hashtags, influencers
Focus groups	Communities affected by mpox	Information, policies and messaging including sources of information, impact of outbreak, attitudes towards transmission-reducing behaviour
Interviews	Nigeria: Older adolescents (15-17 years), parents, key stakeholders UK: People with recently acquired mpox	Experiences of mpox, including mental health, stigma, experience of transmission reduction strategies, healthcare access and experience, wellbeing and support
Photography	People with recently acquired mpox (UK)	Experiences of mpox including stigma, support, wellbeing

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
Pandemic preparedness

Establishing structures and systems to enable rapid response to (re)emerging infections using robust qualitative methods:

- 1. Establish collaborations and community partnerships
- 2. Build network of collaborating sexual health clinics
- Develop management structure and procedures, including developing standard operating procedures for all tasks
- Capacity and team building: qualitative research training and experience
- 5. Methodological innovation and modular research design

- In the spirit of generosity and collaboration!


